

HENDAL PRIMARY SPORTS PREMIUM FUNDING

What is the sports premium budget?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum to provide new primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Purpose of the funding

Each school will receive £8000, plus £5 per pupil. Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they have the freedom to choose how they do this.

How will we invest this at Hendal Primary?

Investment will be made to ensure the longevity of quality taught PE and sport, we will continue to invest in various ways to achieve this. By monitoring closely different initiatives all pupils can develop healthy and active lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of, obtaining a positive attitude toward being healthy.

Impact of previous sports funding

Children continue to enjoy physical education in foundation stage and good attainment is made in the prime area of physical development. Throughout key stage 1 and 2 children are continuing enjoying 2 hours of quality PE a week, they understand the importance of keeping fit and being healthy and feel they learn new skills. Staff continue to feel more confident delivering PE, feel they have a greater knowledge and understanding of delivering a PE lesson and continue to feel they deliver a higher standard of PE (PE, staff and pupil audit 2015/16).

How will the 2016/17 sports premium be spent?

The following is a summary of how Hendal Primary School has allocated the 2016/17 sports premium grant (£9,180).

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Total Expenditure: £6,766

Priority 1: To continue to improve the quality of teaching PE and range of sports taught in our school.

Action:

- PE specialist to continue to work alongside staff when delivering PE lessons increasing subject knowledge and confidence in areas highlighted in previous PE audit.
- PE specialist to share good planning and work alongside teachers supporting medium term planning.
- PE leader to complete audit of staff skills and identify strengths across the whole school staff and areas for development.

HEALTHY AND ACTIVE LIFESTYLES

Priority 1: To provide opportunities for children to be active at school.

Total Expenditure: £750

Action:

- PE specialist to train sports leaders to deliver sporting activities at lunch time.
- Lunch time supervisors to be trained by the PE specialist to deliver a range of playground games.
- Provide new sporting play equipment for play times and lunch times.
- Purchase playground zone signs and sports leaders vests.

CLUB AND COMPETITIVE SCHOOL SPORT

Total Expenditure: £1,664

Priority 1: To continue to increase the number of sporting clubs and activities on offer to a wider age range of pupils

Action:

- Continue to introduce new sporting afterschool clubs at the request of the children.
- Offer a sporting afterschool club to both KS1 and KS2 each half term.
- Set up wake-up-shake-up to run each morning before school.

Priority 2: To continue to participate in intra-school and inter-school sporting competitions.

Action:

- Organise competitive sports day in both KS1 and KS2.
- Organise sports week, providing coaches to deliver a range of sporting activities throughout school, allowing pupils to participate in new sports.
- Continue to take part in Kettlethorpe pyramid sports competitions.
